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RAISING CHILDREN AND ACCESSING EDUCATION

We all have a role to play to foster children's and teenagers' development and help them thrive. Children are the adults of tomorrow; we need to give them the opportunity to fulfill their potential and support them every day so they can grow into well-rounded adults.

In Québec, services and activities for youth are plentiful. Children can start daycare (ages 0 to 5) before attending school (as of age 6). Do not hesitate to sign your child up for daycare and other activities: It is a great way to integrate them into their new community. And for parents, it is a nice opportunity to meet other parents and build a social network.

A TYPICAL PATH

DAYCARE · CHILDCARE CENTRES (CPE)

AGES 0 TO 5

The pedagogical program of daycares promotes play, socialization, and the overall development of children, in addition to gradually preparing them to start kindergarten.

Daycare is not mandatory.

KINDERGARTEN

AGES 4 AND 5 – FREE

Kindergarten, also known as preschool, is not mandatory but 98% of children aged 5 are registered for kindergarten. Kindergarten offers children the opportunity to socialize, practise French, and get ready to start elementary school.

In some schools, children can start kindergarten at the age of 4. You should consider, however, that children in kindergarten cannot access daycare services or the municipal summer day camp.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

AGES 6 TO 12 – FREE

Elementary school takes six years to complete. Classes are held Monday to Friday, for five hours per day. Each class is taught by an accredited teacher.

Other teachers teach specialized courses: music, physical education, English, etc. Schools also offer morning, lunch time, and afternoon childcare services (for a fee) outside of classroom hours.

Children must bring their own lunch to school, with a few exceptions.

HIGH SCHOOL

AGES 12 TO 17 – FREE

High school takes five years to complete. Classes are held Monday to Friday, for five hours per day. Each subject is taught by a different teacher. In the first two years, all students take the same classes. Then, students can choose different classes based on their interests and skills.

CEGEP

AGE 17+

CEGEP is the acronym for Collège d'enseignement général et professionnel, which translates as college of general and vocational education. The CEGEP system is specific to Québec and is the equivalent of junior college, offering post-secondary education between high school and university. CEGEP offers three study options:

- A two-year pre-university diploma to pursue university studies.
- A three-year technical diploma (technique in French) to enter the job market after graduation or pursue university studies.
- Continuing education: for individuals who want to update their professional skills or for companies who want their labour force's qualification perfected or improved.

Study duration varies depending on the option chosen. The student chooses the program (field) that best suits their needs and expectations.

UNIVERSITY

AGE 18+

University has different levels of study: certificates, advanced graduate diplomas, bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, doctorates, and post-doctoral fellowships. Study duration varies based on the level and subject.

DAYCARES

If you have children between the ages of 0 and 5, you may need a daycare that will look after them while you are training or working. Daycares are open during the day only, usually between 7am and 5:30pm.

TYPES OF DAYCARES

The centres de la petite enfance (CPE) are government-subsidized public daycares. This means the government pays a portion of the childcare costs and you pay the rest. Costs are relatively low. Children are grouped by age and follow a pedagogical program tailored to their age group.

There are also **licensed private daycares**. These can be subsidized or not. Private daycares are more expensive.

Educational home childcare services welcome children in private homes. There are fewer children and they are placed all together, regardless of their age, just like in a family. This service may also be subsidized or not. Costs are similar to those of a CPE. These types of childcare services are supervised and professional.



GOOD TO KNOW

To put the odds in your favour, register quickly (as soon as you arrive in Québec or as soon as you get pregnant) with La Place 0-5, the sole gateway to daycare spaces in Québec:

It can take several months or years before a space frees up for your child.

HOW TO FIND A SPOT IN A DAYCARE

- 1 Use the search tool from the ministère de la Famille or contact the daycares directly.
- 2 Consult websites, bulletin boards in businesses or organizations, or the **Place en garderie Baie-Comeau Facebook Page:** www.facebook.com/groups/1009763855716334
- 3 Ask around; a neighbour or colleague might be able to refer you.
- 4 Follow up regularly as a spot may open up.

ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOL

In Québec, school is compulsory for all children aged 6 to 16. In public schools, tuition and textbooks are free from kindergarten right through high school. However, tuition and textbooks are not free in private schools or for certain public school special or honours programs.

As French is the official language of Québec, the vast majority of children must attend French-language schools until the end of high school.

The school year begins in late August or early September. It ends no later than June 24, Québec's national holiday. There are usually two weeks off for the end-of-year holidays (late December to early January) and one week off (spring break) at the beginning of March. Schools are co-ed (boys and girls in the same class), and the education system is secular.

REGISTERING YOUR CHILD FOR SCHOOL

You must register your child for school every year. The regular registration period is held during the last two weeks of February for the school year starting in August/September.

Your child must be 4 or 5 years of age by September 30 of the current school year for them to be eligible for kindergarten. For elementary school, your child must be 6 years of age by September 30.

Parents can choose which school to send their children to. However, if the school selected is not in your district (i.e., it is far from your home), you cannot request the school bus services. In this instance, you would need to drive your child to and from school. This is an important point to consider before choosing a school.

Registering your child is simple. Call the secretary of the school you selected, register your child, and mention any childcare needs you have outside of class hours.

The schools that are part of the Centre de services scolaire de l'Estuaire offer a wide variety of educational projects and special programs that will meet your child's aspirations.



GOOD TO KNOW

If you move to Manicouagan outside of the regular school registration period in February

MARCH BREAK

Students in preschool, elementary school, and high school get a week off **the first week of March**, known as spring break. Several recreational organizations have activities to keep your kids entertained.

SUMMER BREAK

From the end of June to the end of August, schools are closed for summer break. The City of Baie-Comeau organizes a day camp to keep kids aged 5 to 12 entertained. Kids participate in fun activities tailored to their age and interests. They are supervised by trained camp counsellors to ensure their safety and well-being.

On the agenda: outdoor games, team sports, arts and crafts, swimming, artistic activities, and more.

This service is very practical for parents who work during the summer.

Registration usually takes place in May.

Depending on the year, other camps may be offered by non-profit organizations or private businesses. Every spring, these organizations advertise their camps in local media and on social media.

POST-SECONDARY STUDIES

CÉGEP DE BAIE-COMEAU

CEGEP is the first step in post-secondary education in Québec. Students attend CEGEP after high school and before university.

CEGEP offers three types of diplomas:

- Pre-university two-year program (field) to get a diploma of college studies (DCS): prepares students to pursue their studies at the university level in the program of their choice.
- The three-year technical program (technique) to get a diploma of college studies (DCS): prepares students for the job market; students can pursue university studies after a technical program as well.
- The attestation of college studies (AEC) for adults (less than three years).

The Cégep de Baie-Comeau is renowned for its human-centered focus and personalized approach. In addition to offering high-quality advanced technical training with excellent job prospects, it provides a variety of activities to support the development and fulfillment of its students.

CENTRE DE FORMATION PROFESSIONNELLE DE L'ESTUAIRE

The CFP de l'Estuaire is a vocational training centre offering a range of programs of study (field). Students attend vocational training centres to:

- Get a Diploma of Vocational Studies (DVS) or an Attestation of Vocational Specialization (AVS).
- Acquire the skills required for a trade or profession that they like or are interested in.
- Get official recognition for prior learning and competencies acquired outside of school to help them obtain a diploma faster.

UNIVERSITY

Québec universities follow a similar structure as other North American universities. They offer three degree levels:

- Bachelor's degree (undergraduate), which takes three to four years depending on the field.
- Master's degree (graduate), which takes between one and two years.
- Doctoral (PhD) degree (graduate), which takes three years or more.

Most universities also offer shorter programs of varying duration such as certificates or advanced graduate diplomas.

The University of Québec at Rimouski (UQAR) has a satellite campus at the Cégep de Baie-Comeau. This means you can register for certain programs without having to leave Baie-Comeau.

PARENTING

In Québec, parents must provide their children with the security and care they need to thrive.

For example, you must not:

- Leave a child under 10 years of age home alone, unsupervised.
- Let a young child play unsupervised in building common areas, parking lots, or in the street for example. From the age of 6, children can generally play outside with their friends in a safe area you have specified the limits to (e.g., the yard or the park).
- Leave your child alone in an area where there is a swimming pool or body of water.
- Leave your child under the age of 7 unsupervised in a car. This is very dangerous, especially in very hot or very cold weather.



FAMILY ALLOWANCE AND CHILD BENEFIT

Canadian citizens and permanent residents who have children under 18 years of age are eligible for financial benefits. Temporary residents (study or work permits) who have been living in Québec for at least 18 months can also apply for the benefit. Check your eligibility.


