

Without Facebook, you can get in touch with people through email. If you are reluctant to create a Facebook account, consult the platform's security settings beforehand. It might inform your decision.

BEWARE OF FAKE NEWS

Social media does have its drawbacks, including fake news.

What is fake news? It is news that is false, exaggerated, or distorted to the extent that it is no longer true. The problem is that it is presented as real news to deceive people. Fake news can be used to generate clicks and shares on social networks, to achieve any number of objectives (political, ideological, economic, etc.), or simply to mock the credulity of readers.*



BULLETIN BOARDS


Many organizations have bulletin boards or notice boards in their entrances. Here, you can find information on events and services for residents.
